NAAE Report – Allison Touchstone, IVATA President

- o National Conference was moved to Kansas City this year due to Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans
- o NAAE Life membership still available; added active and inactive life membership status to be used when calculating voting; increased organizational dues to \$750
- o NAAE Budget Overview by Nate Low; NAAE Agriculture Teacher Relief Fund established for those teachers impacted by Hurricane Katrina
- o NAAE is printing new NAAE recruitment brochures for recruiting students into the ag teaching profession.

AST Program Manager Report - Dick Ledington, AST Program Manager, IDPTE

- 1. Dick responded to questions about extended contracts. Dick also indicated that calls from administrators this year were primarily about days out of school.
- 2. Instructors were encouraged to nominate persons for the three adult voting member on the FFA nominating committee.
- 3. Schools that have contacted the State Division about possible new Agriculture Science & Technology programs are: Kamiah, Grangeville, Salmon River (Riggins), and Horseshoe Bend.
- 4. Summer Conference for 2006 is in Twin Falls on June 27-30. The 2007 summer conference will be in North Idaho, possibly Lewiston, although a site has not been selected as of this date.
- 5. CAERT Curriculum project is progressing nicely. Instructors were reminded that this is a subscription service and only those that subscribe will receive the product. The two curriculum libraries to be distributed at summer conference are: Animal and Plant Science, and Ag Mechanics Technology.
- 6. Certification issues with the Natural Science and Consumer Economics endorsements were debated by the Professional Standards Commission this year. Although changes were made to both, it was felt by Dr. Ledington and Dr. Riesenberg that the changes were reasonable and could be incorporated into existing class schedule for agricultural education undergraduates.

Report by Dr. John Mundt, University of Idaho, Dept of Ag & Extension Education

- o Because of budget reductions, the AEE Department is losing its department status and moving to Academic Programs under the administration of Dr. John Foltz. Steve Braun recommended a letter writing campaign of support to Dr. John Hammel, Dean of CALS.
- Dick Ledington moved Allison Touchstone write a letter on behalf of IVATA Board of Directors to UI CALS in support of the AEE mission; amend by Sam Condie to encourage additional letters.
 Amendment passed unanimously. Amended main motion passed.

State FFA Recommendations
