- Roll Call
  - O Committee Members Present: Josette Nebeker (chair), Michelle Ball (secretary), Jodie Mink, Tami Frank, Trish Stokes, Liz Russell, Blaine Campbell, Cami Schumann, Tom Jacobson, Logan Miller Darryl Wadsworth
  - o Non-Voting Members Present: McKena Wallentine and Steve Rayborn
- PD Committee is going to update expert list
- Curriculum guide revision reviews
- Cluster vs Pathway
  - o Having different IC numbers
  - o Re-look at how pathways are structured
    - Have a lot of structures and facilities that interrelate
  - o Pathways are specifically based on the standards developed
    - Based on standards
    - Not based on how many classes
    - Let's meet at perhaps summer conference
    - If we are redoing standards- lets redo that then redo pathways
    - CSI is the program that is going to be involved
    - Review standards and see if we need to add or delete
    - Figure out where we are going to figure out what is going to be
  - o Dual Credit Discussion
    - AVS 105 Survey with University of Idaho
    - This is going away unless we have a direct correlation of class and university/post secondary course
    - Primary alignment is to CSI and one with CWI (for horticulture only)
    - We could go through University of Idhao but have to align with our pathways
  - o How will Perkins funds be affected if programs become only cluster programs
    - Most smaller districts are in a consortium
      - One school has a program with a pathway and would qualify the whole consortium
      - All programs in the consortium should benefit
      - If there are no pathways in any CTE funded programs- there would not be funded
      - Small schools, teachers may be asked/mandated to teach junior high classes (which are not funded)
    - Why can't we fund junior high?
      - Can use up to 20% of Perkins for the middle school program
        - O But also have to have additional advisory committee/leadership for the group/middle school program
      - Can't fund middle school classes unless they can be tied to the high school program

- o How can we develop these curriculum
  - Updating it? Use our efforts to this maybe the best use of our time
  - Grass roots efforts are better than top down
- o Thursday would be the day for Skill Stack for summer conference
- o Recommendation from committee
  - If we want to change the pathways- we need to have a strong say
  - What pathways do we need to create?
  - Concern about applied greenhouse class as a capstone
  - Ag Econ Capstone was already addressed
  - Plant Science classes at the 500 level usually is made into the capstone
  - Ag Fab- tough as a pathway would only be articulated to University of Idaho
  - Would more small engines courses be created?
  - You could teach ag welding based on the standards to 1 course
  - Communities are diverse and clusters are essential for small communities
  - Need to be careful on what the capstone for horticulture should not be in applied greenhouse management
  - Don't want to put dual credit out there as a capstone
  - Small schools use lots of ag classes as science and economics credits
  - Ag Bio is 502
- O Kids are getting more money through FastForward and are needing more college classes earlier
- o Recommendations
  - Encourage use and upload of curriculum to COP NAAE and sharing of curriculum
  - Add Intro to ag industries Ag 120 to all pathways
    - This would be a generic pathway that could go animal science, plant soil science, or other ag areas
  - Creation of a committee to work with Steve Rayborn work on the creation of pathways and evaluate the current pathways
    - Have a representative from each district for the committee
    - Have a couple alternatives for the capstone coming from the committee
  - What pathways do we need and want and what do we not want/need
  - Need recognition that ag kids are going on to academic but aren't counted as technical students.
  - Creation of committee to write the USDA SPECA Grant open to nominations
  - Replace Ag 514 for the Horticulture Capstone
  - Moved by Tom Jacobsen and seconded by Blaine Campbell. Passes
