CDEs and LDEs

Individual Challenge Events Replace National Level CDEs and LDEs for 2020

This fall, the National FFA Organization will offer individual experiences and challenges focused on career and leadership skills for all FFA members in place of all traditional national-level career and leadership development events (CDEs/LDEs) previously scheduled for the 2020 National FFA Convention & Expo. The changes are in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

National FFA will also use the traditional awards process during the 2020 National FFA Convention & Expo to recognize all individuals and teams declared for national CDE and LDE competition this fall despite being unable to compete.

National-level CDEs and LDEs will return at the 2021 National FFA Convention & Expo. Please contact Christine White (cwhite@ffa.org) with any questions.

FFA COVID-19 Chapter Assistance Program

FFA chapters faced with loss of revenue due to the pandemic are eligible for the FFA COVID-19 Chapter Assistance Program. The program requires an application and offers up to \$2,000 in one-time financial assistance per chapter to offset pandemic-related losses. **Apply by June 12.** Financial assistance will be provided based upon funding availability and demonstrated need.

FFA Alumni and Supporters Grants

- There is one remaining deadline for 2020 FFA Alumni and Supporter grant applications: Sept. 1.
- Available grants include \$500 for starting and improving alumni and supporter chapters, \$1,000 grants for alumni and student members to partner together on projects or events, and \$5,000 grants to help pay for student affiliation fees, plant sciencebased projects or other agriculture program materials.
