 - New instructor hired- Brian Semper- Ag faculty
 - CSI aquaculture new facility coming- Matt Wilson stepped down as head of aquaculture
 - New position will not be a full aquaculture manager, will be instructor with teaching facilities managed by Riverence (formerly Clear Springs)
 - Awarded USDA SPECA grant
 - \$50,000 for precision ag curriculum and training for 10 high school teachers
 - Willing to provide tours and help future students

- U of I CALS/ AELC update- Dr. Wolf, AELC Interim Department Head
 - Jim Connors last day as Dept Head is June 30
 - Dr. Kat Wolf starts July 1 as Interim Department Head
 - 963 students, 155 advisors and chaperones attended State CDE's
 - 107 undergrad, 10 grad, 56 Ag. Ed. majors
 - 100 newly admitted Ag. Ed. major students
 - 10 student teachers in 2023, 9 student teaching in Idaho, 1 in Washington
 - 14 student teachers for 2024
 - Enrollment up 11.3% in CALS
 - CAFE is breaking ground June 30 in Rupert, plans to open in 2024
 - Meat Lab honoring Ron Richards will break ground in 2023
 - Dr. Smith promoted to Tenure Professor

 - Motion passed that all contestants will give oral reasons at the end of the livestock judging event instead of in a rotation
- Motion passed that Idaho CDEs will be open to continuous changes as recommended by the Idaho FFA delegates, the IATA, with a final vote by the FFA Board of Directors if posted by October 1st.
- Motion passed that New Official State CDEs must be approved by the Idaho FFA Delegates, the IATA, and the Idaho FFA Board of Directors by summer conference the year before they are officially offered.

 - Moved by Danielle Reynolds to accept the minutes as read, seconded by Sam Hoffman. Motion Passed unanimously
- FFA Relations Committee Report-- Daniel Heikkila
 - Recommendation that the Secretary-elect to document FFA Relations action items and report them to IATA. A table has been recommended to use.
 - Recommended a clear and concise expectation of dress code for Gem State
 - Recommends that delegate issues are open during registration
 - Recommends BOD update standing rules on creating a procedure for FFA business to flow through IATA committees, student delegates, and FFA BOD
 - Recommends that the virtual FFA Chapter for ITCA’s K-12 begins the process for a FFA Charter and the chapter be placed in a district. Students need to be enrolled in an accredited virtual school full-time, that receives state CTE funding and cannot be dual enrolled in another K-12 school.
