- Topics have been previously emailed
- Chapter Challenge will be at the Golf Scramble Tournaments
- CTE
  - Legislation approved the proposed budget
  - Accepted request for additional Added-Cost, will be able to fund Middle School programs
  - New programs approved within the last 2 years but not funded will now be able to be funded by Added Cost
  - CTE requested 5 new IQPS grants
    - Dygert helped lobby for 7 more
    - A total of 42 IQPS Grants will be awarded annually
    - Need to change the language in IDAPA to include middle school teachers be awarded IQPS
  - Hired Chet Andes for the Program Manager Supervisor
- Operational Survey has been sent out by Clay Long
  - Responses needed to help guide CTE's direction
- Dr. Woodard attempting to see 6-8 state conventions per year
  - Idaho included in 2022 with 2 national officers

# VII. Idaho FFA Alumni Report

Lance Zollinger, Idaho FFA Alumni Report

- Annual meeting 4-8
  - Importance of having successful foundation to support chapters
  - Want to create easy access to advisors with contacts from Alumni
  - Shay Saralecos president elect
  - Alumni chapters 52 in the state of Idaho
    - Nearly 5,000 registered members
  - Working to inventory strengths of alumni members and share list with advisors
  - Working well with foundation and association to support FFA members

### VIII. CALS Update

Matt Doumit, CALS Associate Dean

- Dr. Connors stepping down as Dept. Head in June
- Ag ed has 50% more students than previous year
- Plans to fill dept head with interim
  - College wide search
  - Can serve for up to 23 months
  - National search for permanent head will occur during interim service
- Dr. Bush leaving for Univ. of Florida
- Filling positions
  - Ag mech (soil/water-AELC)
  - Plant sciences positions (2), replacing Dr. Jack Brown and Dr. Bob Tripeppi
- Nancy Cummings research facility- Salmon
  - Intended to be livestock resource for that community
- Breaking ground on parma research/extension
  - Idaho center for Plant and Soil health
- CAFE
  - Rupert
  - Largest research dairy in the western US
  - 10 years after approval
- March 29- Seed potato germ plasm opened
  - Disease free seed stock for 90% of potato varieties in Idaho
  - Classroom to be used during CDE's

- Approval to break ground on agri-beef meat science/innovation center
  - In memory of Ron Richard
  - Increased construction cost causing delays
  - South of potato facility/ across from kibbie dome
- Chobani scholars about to be selected
  - Scholarship broadened to allow more student eligibility
  - \$20,000 per student, \$5,000 per year
  - Chobani support this program for additional 5 years
- Private donor offers 14- \$2500 CALS scholarships
  - ½ in state, ½ out of state
  - In perpetuity
- Denny Biram fund for students unable to complete degrees due to financial hardship
  - Continues to serve Uldaho students
- University adopts metric model for funding
  - Lost 700,000 in gen ed funding due to declining enrollment
  - CALS welcomes this new funding model
    - 172,000 funds gained in the first year of this new model
- Kacie Hoffman
  - Academic programs director of recruitment/ student engagement
- 25 student ambassadors for CALS
- Increase 700 to 774 undergrad students over the past 2 years
- 902 admitted students in cals in April 2022
  - Should exceed 2025 goal in 2022
- CALS residence hall adding 2nd floor
- Working on housing options for state CDE's
- Sept 30th- Oct 2nd- CALS days
  - During homecoming weekend
  - Working on housing options because of homecoming weekend

- Students numbers have been growing
  - Hiring a new faculty member to begin this Fall (Brian Simper)
- Funding through NorthWest Farm Credit for a small ruminant grazing facility
  - GIS and Precision Ag component as well
- Hosting a CASE AFNR seminar
  - July 31- Aug 10
- Ag Scholarships
  - Students should still apply, the sooner the better
