2024 Event Format

We are thrilled at the turnout last year for this event! We are planning on opening the 2024 event to ALL CONTESTANTS who are interested, with no limit to the number of contestants per district or chapter. This document is your guide as you prepare to join the event at state convention

Deadlines

To facilitate the completion of the event, you must

- **Submit registration by MARCH 15th ([link](#))**
- **Submit your lesson plan by MARCH 25th**

What is provided:

- Computer with internet access
- Projector
- Clicker
- Standard Classroom Supply Basket (enough for each student)
 - Writing utensils,
 - Scissors,
 - Rulers,
 - Glue sticks,
 - Colored pencils,
 - Sharpie markers,
 - Tape

What you will need:

- Handouts and supplies
 - Supplies
 - You will need enough supplies (lab materials, etc.) for **12 students in the semi-finals and 12 students in the finals (24 total)**
 - Need handouts for students?
 - If you don't meet the deadline, we will assume you are planning on bringing enough copies for BOTH rounds
- Any digital media you are planning on presenting
 - Double check to ensure these are saved to your flash drive, online drive, etc.
- **(2) TWO friends** who are not competing to serve as the "students"
 - They will be placed in a room the chapter competitor is not competing in for the preliminary round
 - If you advance to the finals, they will be asked to stay and serve as the students for the finals round for all 6 finalists

- *Due to potential time conflicts, we ask that the students you bring are not involved in the Ag Issues CDE or the delegate process*
- Their job? Serve as the “students” in the class. They will complete the tasks the competitor asks. We remind students that they should act like model students and complete all tasks to the best of their ability.

Event Timeline/Format

The event will occur on Wednesday, April 3rd on the CSI Campus

- Rounds will be determined based on number of contestants
 - Approximately 6 students per round
 - Top student(s) will be selected for the final round of 5 students
- 2:00pm: Orientation (Shields 114)
 - Contestants and chapter “students” (2 per competitor) report to orientation room
- Following Orientation: Test
 - Twenty-five (25) questions will address teaching and learning in agricultural education.
 - Twenty-five (25) questions will address content area knowledge relevant to the AFNR content areas
- Following Test: Semi-Final Round 1 & 2 (if needed)
 - There will be 3 rooms of competitors (randomly assigned)
 - “Students” from each chapter will be placed in separate rooms from the competitor from their chapter
- Approximately 5:00pm Finals Round
 - Finalists from each room based on lesson plan, test, and semi-finals lesson presentation will advance to the finals
 - “Students” brought with each of the finalists will serve as the students in the final round
