9. CTE Report- Clay Long

- a. Top 10 tuesday emails with important info sent out monthly
- b. CTE is going out for bids on a data system
 - i. Legislature has provided \$1.5 million to begin this process
 - ii. About a year out on a new data system
- c. Looking at taking March ISEE data and providing a draft of 2024 added cost funding to districts
- d. Legislature
 - i. Clay is cautiously optimistic about new leadership in the legislature, especially within the house education committee.
 - ii. CTE is very supported throughout the legislature
 - iii. 410 million in education funding that is not allocated yet
 - 1. Clay hopes that a large portion will go toward Idaho CTE
 - iv. New state superintendent is supportive of CTE
- e. CTE Budget
 - Requested new staffing positions, increase in added cost funding (\$700,000 last year, approx. \$1.4 million additional needed based on 2022 projections), apprenticeship grant, FEMA fire training funds.
 - ii. After the increase, Clay wants to have one time grants anywhere between \$2 Million and \$40 million for consumables and equipment

- iii. Middle school funding is part of the additional 1.4 million dollar request, and is a priority to the state department of CTE. Anticipate \$2,000 per FTE for middle school program (Career exploration course)
 - 1. It is not the intent of Idaho CTE to fully fund middle school content areas. (middle school ag programs)
