FFA Environmental Grants Awarded

FFA chapters in 26 states and representing 42 communities were awarded grants for developing plans that address environmental issues in their communities. The grants will help them implement their plans. Chapters received up to \$2,000 in funds from FFA's Living to Serve: Environmental Grant Program.

The grants are provided through funding from CSX and Bayer as a special project of the National FFA Foundation. Each winning project includes plans to invest the time of FFA members, community members and local leaders in a service-learning project that tackles issues of environmental work, sustainability, and/or restoration. TEAMS REPRESENTING FOUR STATES INCLUDING ID, NV, UT, AND WY

The fifth annual Western National Rangeland CDE took place November 7-8 in Hailey, ID. As a cooperative project of the University of Idaho Rangeland Center, University of Nevada - Reno, Utah State University, the University of Wyoming, and the Idaho Rangeland Resource Center,

the event focuses on five areas of western rangeland management. The CDE provides a career exploration component involving direct interaction with rangeland professionals from multiple local, state, federal, and private agencies.

The 2016 event saw 1st and 3rd place go to Wells and Ruby Mountain, Nevada while the team from Gooding, Idaho took 2nd place.

Alaska FFA Association wins national Hunger Heroes Challenge

NATIONWIDE 37,000 VOLUNTEERS RECORDED 191,322 HOURS OF SERVICE

The FFA Hunger Heroes Challenge encouraged students to help donate 3.5 million meals to local communities before the 2016 National FFA Convention & Expo in October. After each hunger service event, chapters reported impacts and shared their stories to take action and be eligible for a cash drawing. This year, the reported impact was a record-high of 3.8 million meals, with more than 37,000 volunteers recording 191,322 hours of service to fight hunger. Projects varied from community gardens to assembling food baskets for underprivileged families.

This year, the state of Alaska had the highest percentage of chapters that reported impacts. More than 150 members in all middle and high school chapters volunteered 33,919 hours, and more than 35,000 meals and over 37,000 pounds of food were donated.

In addition, the ty of activities.

chapters participated in a varieOne chapter dug up 500 pounds of potatoes and carrots to donate to local families in need while another chapter harvested food from their mobile greenhouse and outdoor garden to donate to the local community.

As a result, Tyson Foods, Inc. will provide a donation to a state-wide Feeding America Food Bank in Alaska.




